Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.
~ Psalm 51:10

It seems like Christmas has just passed. We now stand on the brink of the Lenten season. March 2, a mere 66 days after Christmas, is Ash Wednesday.

Lent is a period of preparation for the events of Holy Week and Easter. For 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter, excluding Sundays, we observe practices that draw us closer to God; practices that help us be ready for God to create in us a clean heart.

Some may undertake the spiritual practice of fasting. Fasting is the abstinence from food and drink, except water, for a period of time; usually a day. Leviticus 23 has God giving Moses instructions for special days and festivals. One of those days is the Day of Atonement. *“Now, the tenth day of this seventh month is the day of atonement; it shall be a holy convocation for you: you shall fast and present the Lord’s offering by fire;”* (Leviticus 23:27, NRSV)

Prayer and fasting is one spiritual practice that folks undertake in order to focus on God. However, in recent times folks are recognizing that one may find that there are things other than food from which to fast. Isaiah speaks to this in Isaiah 58:6; *“Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?”*

During Lent as we consider our relationship with God in the desire to have a clean heart, a new and right spirit, we fast from those things that separate us from God. Pope Francis said the following about fasting for Lent:

*Fast from hurting words ... and say kind words,
Fast from sadness ... and be filled with gratitude,
Fast from anger ... and be filled with patience,
Fast from pessimism ... and be filled with hope,
Fast from worries ... and have trust in God,
Fast from complaints ... and contemplate simplicity,
Fast from pressures ... and be prayerful,
Fast from bitterness ... and fill your hearts with joy,
Fast from selfishness ... and be compassionate to others,
Fast from grudges ... and be reconciled,
Fast from words ... and be silent so you can listen!*

As we travel the road to Jesus’ last Passover meal with His disciples, may we remember that He died because God loves us. He died on our behalf to ensure us eternal life. We remember to turn to God, to Jesus, to the Holy Spirit and to live in such a way as the world would see our Triune God through us.

As we hear the stories of 7 people who encountered Jesus, we will consider what that encounter meant to each of them.

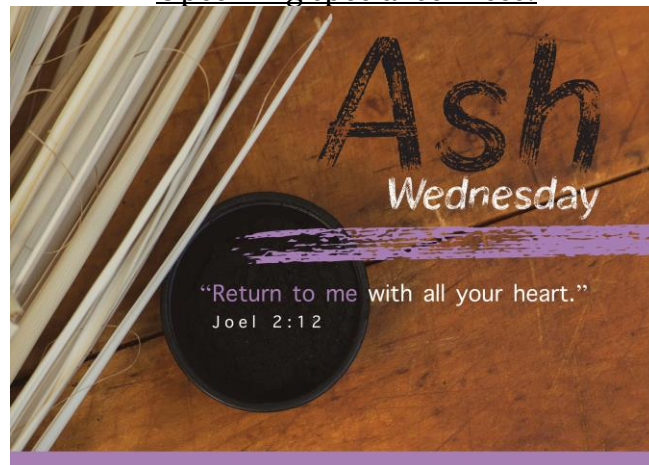
