Under Our Roof

As we turn our calendars from August to September, we turn our thoughts toward Autumn. We await milder temperatures and less humidity. Stores have changed their displays to include pumpkins, hay bales, and autumn-colored leaves. Just visit the church and you will see that Ann Marie and I have decorated our offices for the season.

Every year we mark time by the changing of the seasons. Each one its own characteristics which are both good and not so great. Every year the cycle of seasons is repeated.

Genesis 1 tells us about God's creation of the earth and all that is in it. Even though Genesis does not specifically say that God created the seasons, it does tell us God created day and night; land, sea, and sky; all the vegetation and all living creatures. Therefore, we can trust that God created the seasons.

The writer of Ecclesiastes shows this in the 3rd Chapter. The author begins this chapter; "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven..." (Ecclesiastes 3:1, NRSV). The following verses talk about some of the matters under heaven: birth and death; planting and harvesting, weeping and laughing, mourning and dancing. In the late 1950s Pete Seegar used Ecclesiastes 3 as the basis for his song "Turn, Turn, Turn," which was made popular by the group The Byrds in 1965.

This is one of the Scripture passages families might choose to be read at a funeral because of its relevance to life. "For everything there is a season..."

We experience Spring times. Just like the earth experiences rebirth and new growth; we do as well. Graduations, marriage, birth of children, new jobs come in the Springtime of our lives. And then there is the growing seasons, Summer. We enjoy living and watching our lives develop until we can reap the rewards of that growth in the Autumn of life. Winters are the seasons of challenge. Here in Covington, Winter is characterized by cold, snow, and ice; and by days that have less light. In life there are those times when we struggle. Life seems cold and dark. It is just plain hard, but it is not hopeless.

The good news is that Spring follows Winter, Spring with its regrowth and new growth. How often do we approach March and tell each other that Winter is almost over, Spring is coming? Yes, knowing that each season passes into the next means that when we are in one that is difficult, it gives us an ability to persevere. We also know that we can persevere because God, the author of the seasons, cares for us so that we can look forward in hope.

Psalm 130:7 remind us that we hope because we have God. "O Israel, hope in the Lord! For with the Lord there is steadfast love, and with him is great power to redeem."

God has redeemed each of us in the life of Jesus Christ. We live into that hope. Seasons come and seasons go, and God is present in each of them.

In September as we finish the current study "Confident Hope" we will move into a study of the book of Acts. The early church has much to teach us about being followers of Jesus Christ and being the church.




Brenda plans to review the Christmas Mother Program and the reasons and goals for the Bridging the Gap program. Time is allocated for Q&A.
